

TO SEE GOD MOVE IN OUR NATION AND OUR WORLD:

1. We need to AWAKE!

Men, God is holding you and me responsible for the future of our nation! He's looking for a man to cry out to Him! (Ezekiel 22:23-31).

5. We need to PREVAIL!

For the sake of our families, churches, nation, and world, we must sacrificially join with other men to fervently pray Until Jesus Comes!

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WHAT IS A PRAYER BOOT CAMP?



A Prayer Boot Camp is an all-day Men's event, usually held on a Saturday, but could be during a Friday night-Saturday, or in a weekend retreat setting. The day is divided into five main sections, with a "debrief" session after each one in which men gather in small groups

of three or four men to discuss the previous topic, ask questions, and pray together.

There are periodic times of praise and worship and group prayer throughout the day, as well as periodic breaks.

The challenge given is to call men to rise up and be men of God - to stand in the gap on behalf of a sinful and perverted nation so that God would not have to destroy it.

The challenge is issued by God Himself in Ezekiel 22. God was angry with Israel for their rebellion, disobedience, shedding of innocent blood, sexual perversion, and idolatry. He said in verses 30-31, *“³⁰ So I sought for a man among them who would make a wall, and stand in the gap before Me on behalf of the land, that I should not destroy it; but I found no one. ³¹ Therefore I have poured out My indignation on them; I have consumed them with the fire of My wrath; and I have recompensed their deeds on their own heads,” says the Lord GOD.*”

The day culminates with a call for men to accept the challenge of committing to 21 days of fervent prayer. There are several ways to

organize the follow-up prayer after the Prayer Boot Camp.

1. One way is for men to come together each morning for one hour of prayer with other men, (preferably in person but if not, then by phone or zoom), **to cry out to the Lord on behalf of our nation and world.** The hope is that following the 21 days, a habit of brothers praying together would be established and would continue. Churches or ministries hosting a Prayer Boot Camp will provide a man who will be the Prayer Leader during the 21 days and also afterward to continue the prayer momentum following the 21 days.

2. Another way is to challenge the men to pray for 21 days, but the first seven days are in-person prayer at the church with the group of men - (Suggested 5:00 AM to 6:00 AM, but this could be flexible according to the schedules and availability of the men).

Follow this up with another 14 days of prayer each morning with the men on a zoom or conference call, thus completing the 21 days.

Possibly challenge the church, (men and women) who are not a

part of the 21-day morning prayer emphasis to consider fasting for the 21 days and to pray for the men who are praying each morning. (This could be one or more meals a day or some may want to do a more complete fast.)

By the end of the 21 days the local prayer leader should have challenged each man to choose a prayer and accountability partner to continue praying with by phone each morning or at least once a week. (The first 30 minutes could be the accountability section where they ask each other the hard questions, like John Wesley's Rules of the Bands, for example, and pray for each other. Then the second 30 minutes could be prayer for the nation and world events and certain prayer points that the leader has put forth and that Men for Nations will provide.

Once a week encourage the men to meet in person at the church, or other location to pray together. (The Topeka, KS group prays for the first hour together and then they go out on the streets for a second hour and do prayer walks in troubled areas of the city or county. *They have seen amazing answers to*

*prayer as a result of this warfare
praying, including the murder rate in
their city cut in half!).*
